

Probate Notes for July 8, 2014

Probate notes are a recommendation as to the outcome of the petition. Unlike tentative rulings, they do not automatically become adopted as the order of the court. Unless an appearance at the hearing is otherwise required by law, if petitioner submits a proposed order prior to the hearing and the recommendation is to grant the petition, no appearance is necessary. If you are scheduled to appear and there is no probate note issued in your case, you should appear as scheduled. If you wish to continue a matter, you must contact the civil division at (530) 406-6704, at least two (2) court days before your hearing.

Please note: The following probate matters will be heard in **Department Two at 9:00 a.m.**

CASE: Conservatorship of Camarillo
Case No. CV PC 11-210

The parties are **DIRECTED TO APPEAR.**

CASE: Conservatorship of Dao
Case No. CV PC 14-74

The Court notes the following deficiency: The capacity declaration (form GC-335) filed on May 12, 2014, is incomplete as items 1 and 2 are blank, and is not dated by the physician.

CASE: Conservatorship of Kenworthy
Case No. CV PC 14-92

The Court notes the following deficiency: Proof that the notice of hearing has been served on the required parties, including the regional center, has not been filed with the Court. (Prob. Code, § 1822.)

The matter is **CONTINUED** on the Court's own motion to Tuesday, August 19, 2014, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 2 for completion of the court investigator's report.

CASE: Estate of Miller
Case No. CV PB 07-43

It is recommended to grant the petition for final distribution on waiver of accounting and for allowance of statutory compensation to the attorney for ordinary services, and for reimbursement of costs. (Prob. Code, § 11600 et seq.) Petitioner is directed to submit a proposed order prior to the date of the hearing.

CASE: Estate of Miller
Case No. CV PB 89-19430

It is recommended to grant the petition for final distribution on waiver of accounting and for allowance of statutory compensation to the attorney for ordinary services, and for reimbursement of costs. (Prob. Code, § 11600 et seq.) Petitioner is directed to submit a proposed order prior to the date of the hearing.
