

Probate Notes for October 22, 2015

Probate notes are a recommendation as to the outcome of the petition. Unlike tentative rulings, they do not automatically become adopted as the order of the court. Unless an appearance at the hearing is otherwise required by law, if petitioner submits a proposed order prior to the hearing and the recommendation is to grant the petition, no appearance is necessary. If you are scheduled to appear and there is no probate note issued in your case, you should appear as scheduled. If you wish to continue a matter, you must contact the civil division at (530) 406-6704, at least two (2) court days before your hearing.

Please note: The Yolo Superior Court is now located at 1000 Main Street, in Woodland. The following probate matters will be heard in **Department Eleven at 9:00 a.m.**

CASE: Conservatorship of McHugh
Case No. CV PC 12-07

It is recommended to approve the third verified account and report of conservator. (Prob. Code, §§ 1850 et seq., 2620, 1060.)

CASE: Estate of Beede
Case No. CV PB 15-178

The Court notes the following deficiency: Proof of publication must be filed prior to the hearing. (Prob. Code, § 8120 et seq.) Additionally, petitioner is directed to submit a proposed order prior to the date of the hearing.

CASE: Estate of Larson
Case No. CV PB 14-204

It is recommended to grant the petition for first and final account and report of executor, for allowance of statutory compensation for personal representative and attorney fees, for extraordinary compensation, and for final distribution and settlement of the estate. (Prob. Code, § 11600 et seq.)
