TENTATIVE RULING

Case: Corona v. Woodard
Case No. CV PM 16-64
Hearing Date: June 20, 2016 Department Eleven 9:00 a.m.

Defendants Norman Everett Woodard, Jr. and Ava Woodard's motion for a stay of the current action, pending resolution of the criminal proceedings against Mr. Woodard, is **GRANTED IN PART**. In the interest of justice, all discovery shall be stayed pending the resolution of Yolo Superior Case no. CR F 15-4647. (Evid. Code, § 940; *Pacers, Inc. v. Superior Court* (1984) 162 Cal. App. 3d 686; *Keating v. Office of Thrift Supervision* (9th Cir.1995) 45 F.3d 322.)

Defendants' motion to quash the third party subpoenas is **GRANTED** based on the Court's above order granting a stay of all discovery.

If no hearing is requested, this tentative ruling is effective immediately. No formal order pursuant to California Rule of Court 3.1312, or further notice is required.

Defendant Barbara McGee's motion for summary judgment is **DENIED**. (Code Civ. Proc., § 437c.) Defendant failed to submit any admissible evidence to support her motion. (Evid. Code, § 1401, subd. (a).)
