

Probate Notes for January 11, 2016

Probate notes are a recommendation as to the outcome of the petition. Unlike tentative rulings, they do not automatically become adopted as the order of the court. Unless an appearance at the hearing is otherwise required by law, if petitioner submits a proposed order prior to the hearing and the recommendation is to grant the petition, no appearance is necessary. If you are scheduled to appear and there is no probate note issued in your case, you should appear as scheduled. If you wish to continue a matter, you must contact the civil division at (530) 406-6704, at least two (2) court days before your hearing.

Please note: The Yolo Superior Court is now located at 1000 Main Street, in Woodland. The following probate matters will be heard in **Department Eleven at 9:00 a.m.**

CASE: Conservatorship of Marrow
Case No. CV PC 15-214

The Court is informed that the proposed conservatee passed away on December 19, 2015. Therefore, the petition is **DROPPED FROM CALENDAR.**

CASE: Estate of Cadero
Case No. CV PB 15-30

The Court notes the following deficiency: The Court notes that the Notice of Petition to Administer Estate was served on several individuals not listed in paragraph 8 of the petition. To the extent those individuals are issue of the decedent's grandparents, their name, relationship to decedent, age, and address should be listed in paragraph 8 of the petition. (Petition, ¶¶ 6, 8.)

CASE: In the Matter of the Culver Family Trust
Case No. CV P2 15-143

It is recommended to grant the unopposed petition to confirm the validity of the trust and confirm successor trustee. (Prob. Code, § 17200, subd. (a).)

CASE: In the Matter of the Seita Family Trust
Case No. CV P2 15-218

It is recommended to grant the unopposed petition to confirm assets to trust. (Prob. Code, § 850 et seq; *Estate of Heggstad* (1993) 16 Cal.App.4th 943.)
