

Probate Notes for January 19, 2016

Probate notes are a recommendation as to the outcome of the petition. Unlike tentative rulings, they do not automatically become adopted as the order of the court. Unless an appearance at the hearing is otherwise required by law, if petitioner submits a proposed order prior to the hearing and the recommendation is to grant the petition, no appearance is necessary. If you are scheduled to appear and there is no probate note issued in your case, you should appear as scheduled. If you wish to continue a matter, you must contact the civil division at (530) 406-6704, at least two (2) court days before your hearing.

Please note: The Yolo Superior Court is now located at 1000 Main Street, in Woodland. The following probate matters will be heard in **Department Eleven at 9:00 a.m.**

CASE: Conservatorship of Gomez
Case No. CV PC 15-161

The Court notes the following deficiency: Petitioner fails to state the reasons the bond is not required in Attachment 1c. (Petition, ¶ 1(c)(1).)

The parties are **DIRECTED TO APPEAR.**

CASE: Conservatorship of Siegel
Case No. CV PC 14-140

It is recommended to approve the court investigator's report. (Prob. Code, § 1850 et seq.)

CASE: Conservatorship of Taylor
Case No. CV PC 15-149

It is recommended to grant the petition for appointment of probate conservator of the person. (Prob. Code, § 1820 et seq.)

CASE: In re the Matter of the Joseph E Alameda Revocable Trust
Case No. CV P2 15-228

On the Court's own motion, the matter is **CONTINUED** to Tuesday, February 2, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 11 so that the Court may more thoroughly consider the petition filed by Joseph Alameda, Jr.
