

Probate Notes for March 14, 2016

Probate notes are a recommendation as to the outcome of the petition. Unlike tentative rulings, they do not automatically become adopted as the order of the court. Unless an appearance at the hearing is otherwise required by law, if petitioner submits a proposed order prior to the hearing and the recommendation is to grant the petition, no appearance is necessary. If you are scheduled to appear and there is no probate note issued in your case, you should appear as scheduled. If you wish to continue a matter, you must contact the civil division at (530) 406-6704, at least two (2) court days before your hearing.

Please note: The Yolo Superior Court is now located at 1000 Main Street, in Woodland. The following probate matters will be heard in **Department Eleven at 9:00 a.m.**

CASE: In the Matter of the Hess Family Trust
Case No. CV P2 14-30

It is recommended to grant David Richardson's petition for an order authorizing the payment of his fees and to relieve him as Thelma Elsie Hess's court appointed counsel and guardian ad litem, based on Ms. Hess's death on December 28, 2015. (Prob. Code, §§ 1003, 1470.)

CASE: Estate of Rich
Case No. CV PB 15-90

It is recommended to grant the petition for final distribution on waiver of accounting, for allowance of statutory compensation to the administrator and attorneys for ordinary services, for reimbursement of costs, and for final distribution and settlement of the estate. (Prob. Code, § 11600 et seq.) Petitioner is directed to submit a proposed order prior to the date of the hearing.
