

Probate Notes for April 19, 2016

Probate notes are a recommendation as to the outcome of the petition. Unlike tentative rulings, they do not automatically become adopted as the order of the court. Unless an appearance at the hearing is otherwise required by law, if petitioner submits a proposed order prior to the hearing and the recommendation is to grant the petition, no appearance is necessary. If you are scheduled to appear and there is no probate note issued in your case, you should appear as scheduled. If you wish to continue a matter, you must contact the civil division at (530) 406-6704, at least two (2) court days before your hearing.

Please note: The Yolo Superior Court is now located at 1000 Main Street, in Woodland. The following probate matters will be heard in **Department Eleven at 9:00 a.m.**

CASE: Estate of Clinton
Case No. CV PB 14-154

The Court notes the following deficiency: Petitioner fails to include a detailed schedule of receipts as required to support the request for statutory compensation. Petitioner alleges that a schedule of receipts is attached to the petition as Exhibit D. However, the petition only includes Exhibits A through C. (Petition, ¶¶ 20, 25; Cal. Rules of Court, rules 7.705(b).) Additionally, a proposed order has not been submitted to the Court.

CASE: Estate of Nixon
Case No. CV PB 15-193

If proof of publication is filed with the Court, it is recommended to grant the petition for probate of will and letters testamentary and for authorization to administer the estate under the Independent Administration of Estates Act. (Prob. Code, § 8000 et seq.) Petitioner is directed to submit a proposed order prior to the date of the hearing.

CASE: Estate of Vasquez
Case No. CV PB 16-34

The Court notes the following deficiency: The petition states that Maria Trinidad Vazquez Saavedra, an heir and devisee, resides in Mexico. If it appears that any property will pass to a citizen of a foreign country, notice must be given to a recognized diplomatic or consular official of the foreign country maintaining an office in the United States. (Prob. Code, § 8113.) Petitioner must provide the required notice, or in the alternative, demonstrate that this requirement does not apply.
