

Probate Notes for June 23, 2016

Probate notes are a recommendation as to the outcome of the petition. Unlike tentative rulings, they do not automatically become adopted as the order of the court. Unless an appearance at the hearing is otherwise required by law, if petitioner submits a proposed order prior to the hearing and the recommendation is to grant the petition, no appearance is necessary. If you are scheduled to appear and there is no probate note issued in your case, you should appear as scheduled. If you wish to continue a matter, you must contact the civil division at (530) 406-6704, at least two (2) court days before your hearing.

Please note: The Yolo Superior Court is now located at 1000 Main Street, in Woodland. The following probate matters will be heard in **Department Eleven at 9:00 a.m.**

**CASE: Estate of Jacquemin
Case No. CV PB 13-159**

The parties are **DIRECTED TO APPEAR.** (Prob. Code, § 11700, et seq.)

**CASE: In the Matter of the Gibson Revocable Trust
Case No. CV P2 16-80**

It is recommended to grant the unopposed petition to confirm assets to trust. (Prob. Code, § 850 et seq; *Estate of Heggstad* (1993) 16 Cal.App.4th 943.) Petitioner is directed to submit a proposed order prior to the date of the hearing.

**CASE: In the Matter of the Poor Family Trust
Case No. CV P2 16-77**

It is recommended to deny Cathleen Greenwell's petition to determine validity of the First Amendment to the Jerry Lu Poor Family Trust dated July 16, 2002 ("Trust"). (Prob. Code, § 17200.) Petitioner has failed to provide a copy of the Trust with her petition. Therefore, the Court is unable to determine whether petitioner has standing to bring the current petition or confirm the Trust as the operative Trust instrument as requested.
