

Probate Notes for June 7, 2016

Probate notes are a recommendation as to the outcome of the petition. Unlike tentative rulings, they do not automatically become adopted as the order of the court. Unless an appearance at the hearing is otherwise required by law, if petitioner submits a proposed order prior to the hearing and the recommendation is to grant the petition, no appearance is necessary. If you are scheduled to appear and there is no probate note issued in your case, you should appear as scheduled. If you wish to continue a matter, you must contact the civil division at (530) 406-6704, at least two (2) court days before your hearing.

Please note: The Yolo Superior Court is now located at 1000 Main Street, in Woodland. The following probate matters will be heard in **Department Eleven at 9:00 a.m.**

CASE: Conservatorship of Barnes, Jr.
Case No. CV PC 12-200

On the Court's own motion, the matter is **CONTINUED** to Wednesday, July 6, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 11 for completion of the court investigator's report.

CASE: Conservatorship of Cartoscelli
Case No. CV PC 16-58

The Court notes the following deficiency: Petitioner failed to file a proposed Order Appointing Court Investigator (form GC-330). (Petition, ¶ 13.)

CASE: Conservatorship of Maxwell
Case No. CV PC 14-208

It is recommended to drop the matter from calendar. Nancy G. Maxwell filed a waiver of a final accounting.

CASE: Conservatorship of L. Zalunardo
Case No. CV PC 16-45

The Court notes the following deficiencies:

1. Proof that the citation and petition were served on the proposed conservatee at least 15 days before the hearing has not been filed with the Court. (Prob. Code, § 1824.)
2. An acknowledgment of receipt of the *Duties of Conservator and Acknowledgement of Receipt of Handbook* form has not been filed with the Court. (Prob. Code, § 1834; Cal. Rules of Court, rule 7.1051.)

The parties are **DIRECTED TO APPEAR** to address whether Yolo County is the appropriate forum in light of the proposed conservatee and one of the proposed conservators living in Oregon. (Prob. Code, § 1996.)

CASE: Conservatorship of A. Zalunardo
Case No. CV PC 16-46

The Court notes the following deficiencies:

3. Proof that the citation and petition were served on the proposed conservatee at least 15 days before the hearing has not been filed with the Court. (Prob. Code, § 1824.)
4. Proof that the notice of hearing has been served on the Office of the Veterans Administration has not been filed with the Court. (Prob. Code, § 1822, subd. (d).)
5. An acknowledgment of receipt of the *Duties of Conservator and Acknowledgement of Receipt of Handbook* form has not been filed with the Court. (Prob. Code, § 1834; Cal. Rules of Court, rule 7.1051.)

The parties are **DIRECTED TO APPEAR** to address whether Yolo County is the appropriate forum in light of the proposed conservatee and one of the proposed conservators living in Oregon. (Prob. Code, § 1996.)
