

Probate Notes for October 13, 2016

Probate notes are a recommendation as to the outcome of the petition. Unlike tentative rulings, they do not automatically become adopted as the order of the court. Unless an appearance at the hearing is otherwise required by law, if petitioner submits a proposed order prior to the hearing and the recommendation is to grant the petition, no appearance is necessary. If you are scheduled to appear and there is no probate note issued in your case, you should appear as scheduled. If you wish to continue a matter, you must contact the civil division at (530) 406-6704, at least two (2) court days before your hearing.

Please note: The Yolo Superior Court is now located at 1000 Main Street, in Woodland. The following probate matters will be heard in **Department Eleven at 9:00 a.m.**

CASE: Conservatorship of Beasley
Case No. CV PC 16-148

The Court notes the following deficiencies:

1. To the extent the petitioner requests the proposed conservatee be adjudged to the capacity to give informed consent for medical treatment, paragraph 1(g) is blank.
2. A *Capacity Declaration* (form GC-335) has not been filed with the Court. (Prob. Code, §§ 1881, 1890.)

CASE: Conservatorship of Odenweller
Case No. CV PC 15-112

It is recommended to approve the court investigator's report. (Prob. Code, § 1850 et seq.)

CASE: In the Matter of the Hess Family Trust
Case No. CV P2 14-30

If petitioner files proof that notice of the hearing was served as required, it is recommended to approve Zachary Young's final verified account and report of trustee and petition for distribution of trust and approval of trustee and attorneys' fees. (Prob. Code, §§ 1850 et seq., 2620, 1060.)
