GENERAL INFORMATION FOR PETITIONS FOR DISMISSAL UNDER PEN. CODE §§ 1203.4 AND 1203.4a (MISDEMEANORS AND INFRACTIONS)*

Eligibility	Pen. Code § 1203.4	If probation was granted, defendant may be eligible for relief if the conditions of probation for the entire period of probation have been fulfilled.
	Pen. Code § 1203.4a	If probation was <u>not granted</u> , and more than one year has elapsed since the date of sentencing, defendant may be eligible for relief.
	Case Status	The case must be an ADJUDICATED MATTER. This means that defendant has either entered a plea of guilty or no contest, or a guilty verdict was entered, and defendant was sentenced.
Application	Forms	A "Petition for Dismissal" (CR-180), "Order for Dismissal" (CR-181), and "Declaration" (MC-031) for all applications for dismissal may be obtained at http://www.courts.ca.gov/forms.htm .
		Multiple case numbers for the same defendant must be placed on separate petition(s).
	Court Costs	The defendant may be required to reimburse the court for actual services rendered in processing <u>each</u> petition. Court costs are to be determined by Judicial Officers and defendants will be notified in writing if they are required to pay a fee for services rendered.
	Notice to the Prosecuting Agency	Pursuant to Pen. Code § 1203.4(d), the appropriate prosecuting agency must be given 15 calendar days notice of the filing of the petition to allow time for the filing of an optional objection to the petition.
	Proof of Service	It is the defendant's responsibility to serve the prosecuting agency with any petitions filed and to file a proof of service with the court.
	Opposition	In the event that the District Attorney's Office files an opposition, the court will set a hearing date and notice all parties.
		If you were represented by court-appointed counsel, they may be able to assist you with the dismissal process.
	Processing Time	The processing of the petition may take approximately four to eight weeks from the date it is filed.
Older Records	Since Gov. Code § 68152 allows that some court records be destroyed after five years, the court may not be able to process a petition filed more than five years after a case has been adjudicated, unless documentation of the appropriate court records can be provided.
