Defendants' request for judicial notice in support of motion to stay action is **GRANTED**. (Evid. Code, §§ 452, 453, defendants' RJN Exs. 1-21.)

Plaintiff's request for judicial notice in support of opposition is **GRANTED**. (Evid. Code, §§ 452, 453; plaintiff's RJN, Exs. 1-2.)

Defendants Dignity Health and Dignity Community Care's motion to stay action on grounds of other similar actions pending is **GRANTED**. The power to stay proceedings is incidental to the power inherent in every court to control the disposition of the causes on its docket with economy of time and effort for itself, for counsel, and for litigants. (*Landis v. North American Co.* (1936) 299 U.S. 248, 254.) The action is stayed pending resolution or material change of circumstances regarding the following other matters: Vakili, Buford, Maaba, Sohal, Morales, Holley, Johnson, and Unger. The motion to stay is granted without prejudice to the filing of any motion to lift the stay and coordinate cases.

The Court sets a status review hearing for **Tuesday, February 7, 2023 at 9:00 a.m. in Department 11**.

If no hearing is requested, this tentative ruling is effective immediately. No formal order pursuant to California Rules of Court, rule 3.1312 or further notice is required.
