3 GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF  
4 AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR  
5 OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL

6 Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the  
7 September 30, 2021 Order (“Order”) of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the  
8 Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the September 29, 2021 request for an  
9 emergency order made by the Superior Court of Yolo County (“Court”), this Court HEREBY  
10 FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

11 1. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from October 1,  
12 2021, to October 29, 2021, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period  
13 provided in section 825 of the Penal Code within which a defendant charged with a felony  
14 offense must be taken before a magistrate from 48 hours to not more than 7 days (Gov. Code,  
15 § 68115(a)(8)); and

16 2. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from October 1,  
17 2021, to October 29, 2021, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period  
18 provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than  
19 30 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(10)).\*

20 THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.

27 \* This authority supplements the authority to extend section 1382 deadlines granted in the immediately prior emergency order. Accordingly,  
28 for any case in which the time to bring a defendant to trial was extended under that prior emergency order, and the extended deadline falls  
within the above-specified time period, this order authorizes the Court to extend the previously extended deadline by up to an additional 30  
days. For any case in which the statutory deadline falls within the above-specified time period and is not governed by a prior emergency order,  
this order authorizes the Court to extend the time to bring a defendant to trial by a total of up to 30 days.
